



# FRIENDS OF RUCKLE PARK HERITAGE Beginnings

\* 2015, spearheaded moving a nearby 110-year-old farmhouse to nearby Ruckle Park, for use as an interpretive-administrative centre. *Ruckles' World: A History of South-East Salt Spring Island* by FRPH founder Brenda Guiled published as a fundraiser (200 signed copies, out of print; one copy is in the Salt Spring Library). Despite great community support, the old house was bulldozed.

#### 2016 to present

- began planning with BC Parks and Helen Ruckle (1924 - 2018) how to present family & park history;
- \* 2018, registered as a B.C. non-profit society;
- \* 2018, "Ruckle & Neighbours Fine Arts & Crafts" Historical Society talk and Library exhibit;
- \* 2019 , published "Ruckle Provincial Park Heritage Conservation Plan", for BC Parks, created byHeritageworks, with funding from the Heritage Legacy Fund of B.C. and BC Parks;
- \* interior restoration of the Henry house, with funds from the Heritage Legacy Fund and BC Parks, to prepare it for use as an interpretive centre;
- \* 2020, six new, large interpretive panels unveiled and *Meet the Ruckles* booklet launched, funded by the Salt Spring Island Foundation;
- \* 2022, E-Bike charging station and "Cycling Salt Spring" interpretive sign installed, working with BC Parks, Island Pathways, and other supporters;
- \* 2022, the beginnings of public tours of the Henry & Ella Anna Ruckle farmhouse:
- \* ongoing: restorative gardening in this house's yard.
